

New Church Day

This month we celebrate New Church Day. We thank the Lord for what we know to be true from the Book of Revelation, Chapter 21: 1,2:

"And I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the former heaven and the former earth were passed away; and the sea is no more. And I, John, saw the holy city New Jerusalem coming down from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband."



Whatever truly makes the New Church is, and can only be, the Lord's. The New Church is the Lord's because it is His kingdom on earth. The New Church that comes down from Him out of heaven is therefore whole and perfect. In this sense we need have no fear regarding the future of the New Church.

On New Church Day we also thank the Lord for the privilege we have of being able to serve Him in an organised church which endeavours to be a part of His New Church. In this sense we do need to be concerned for the future and it is here that our responsibility begins. Our Church teachings tell us that everyone receives exactly the same life from the Lord. What makes the difference is how we receive it and this depends on the spiritual states which the Lord has been able to cultivate within us. So it is with His New Church. The state of the New Church varies with each person according to how they have chosen to and been able to receive it into their minds. This applies to people individually and for those societies of people who come together in New Church organisations and churches. As we work on our regeneration in our daily lives, shunning evils as sins and learning new truths from the Word to live, the Lord can open our spiritual mind. This means we will be able to receive His New Church into our minds and lives in deeper and fuller ways. In turn we will be able to love and serve Him and His New Church more and more effectively. This is true church growth and it needs to be the starting place and the inner life of our need to engage in spreading a knowledge of New Church teaching.

Our individual and society church life is very important. Our worship, going to the Word, reflection and prayer should be the best we can make them. This being not primarily for what we get from the church but so that we can express our love to the Lord and to the neighbour in the greatest use of living in the light and life of His New Church. With the New Church quality counts; that is quality of life and quality of teaching.

It always must do because ultimately only the best we can offer is good enough for the Lord and His New Church.

The name of church is given where the Lord is acknowledged and where the Word is known. For the essential elements of the church are love and faith directed to the Lord and coming from the Lord; and the Word teaches how a person must live, in order to receive love and faith from the Lord. (New Jerusalem and its Heavenly Doctrine 242)

For a church to exist, there must be teaching from the Word, since the Word is not intelligible without teaching. But it is not teaching alone that makes the church in the case of a person, but living in accordance with that teaching. (New Jerusalem and its Heavenly Doctrine 243)

Remembering Chris ~ a Tribute from Rev. Ian Arnold

There is something very special about a person who laughs readily and heartily, for whom humour and a joke comes so easily and who, along with this, has his feet firmly planted on the ground and doesn't take himself too seriously. As I saw him to be, this was Chris. And he had other endearing and admirable qualities as well, such as his love for Margaret and his family, his deep and unswerving commitment to the New Church, his clear cut, obvious integrity, his friendliness and his empathy.



It's not manners that make a person, as the old adage has it, it is qualities. And whether as friends along the way, people to whom he ministered or the Church in a more general sense, we were blessed by the Lord through Chris embodying as he did these qualities identified.

I first met Chris in 1961 in his home town of Brightlingsea in Essex in the UK. He was one of a fine group of other young people associated with The New Church there all of whom, remarkably, have had a life long association with it.

An appointment greeted at the time with a mixture of surprise, some slight consternation, but overall welcome, at just 21 Chris was elected Secretary of the Brightlingsea Society of the New Church. And via that appointment and him representing Brightlingsea at annual meetings of The General Conference, Chris emerged onto the national scene of the New Church in the UK.

It was in fact at the annual meeting of the Conference in England, in 1967, held in Haslingden in Lancashire, that – and out for a walk with him one late afternoon there – Chris talked with me of his thoughts about becoming an ordained Minister. Along with his diffidence, and for different reasons, the timing wasn't right for him to proceed to training at that point. But the call was there; it had been heard; and it was to be answered many years later.

We can, I'm sure, all imagine the feelings of New Church people in Brightlingsea, especially, when in 1970 Chris migrated to Melbourne to follow through with marriage to his soul mate Margaret. There was happiness for him but sadness as well at losing this outstandingly committed and fine young member. Overall, however, the New Church didn't "lose" Chris because once in Melbourne he quickly and whole heartedly became involved with the Melbourne Society. Members, ever growing in appreciation of his qualities, Chris was chosen to be the Lay Leader of the Society in 1992. In 1997 both circumstances and opportunity opened up for him to commence training for Ministry and in January 2001 he was ordained, thereafter serving the New Church in Victoria as Pastor. Chris loved people, just as we loved him. He was a "natural" people person, at ease in everyone's company, ever solicitous and ready to respond whenever called upon or where he saw he might be of help. He was a keen evangelist and agitated throughout the years of his ministry as to how best to reach people of the "outside" world; keen for the Church to modernise; ever urging it to use simplified language and concepts to get the message across. And he had the knack of getting alongside people – and representatives – of other faiths, comfortable with his own faith of course and somehow making others feel comfortable with theirs.

Already we are all just so aware of how much we miss Chris. But from where he now is, in the spiritual world, he can – and surely will – be a vehicle in the Lord's hands for the strengthening and encouragement of we who remain as we continue to seek to build the Lord's kingdom in our midst.

It is with a sense of deep sadness that The New Church in Victoria enters a new phase in its life following the passing of our beloved Minister, Pastor, friend and guide into the spiritual world on 23rd April 2015. After being diagnosed with liver cancer in late 2013, Rev Chris Skinner put up a valiant fight against this insidious disease. Our thoughts and prayers are now with Chris's wife Margaret, daughters Suzanne & Tracey, and Suzanne's family.

Following his appointment as Leader of our Society in 1992, Chris worked tirelessly in not only carrying through the worship and pastoral roles he accepted but also the many administrative duties he willingly took on. He was always more than generous with his time. This all continued after his ordination in 2001 and acceptance to become the Minister of The New Church in Victoria. Our Church has greatly benefitted from Chris's leadership and caring nature but also from all the support and input from his dear wife, Margaret, which has been very much appreciated too. The affection and esteem in which Chris and his family are held was shown by the over 250 people from Victoria and further afield who filled the Church and foyer to overflowing for the Thanksgiving Service for Chris's life.

The Committee recognises the difficulties being faced in carrying through the regular activities and management of the Church. However, while accepting the situation has changed considerably with the passing of Rev. Chris Skinner, it is determined to continue serving the Lord's work as best it can. Already a structure has been put in place for the continuance of weekly Sunday services of worship and the pastoral care needs of members and friends. Some details of persons involved are given on the inside cover of this Newsletter. The Committee is grateful that Neville & Alexis Jarvis have agreed to prepare and distribute the Newsletter which is seen to be a very important part of the life of the Church. Please let Neville & Alexis know of anything you wish to have included in each issue.

THE PILLARS OF NEW CHURCH BELIEFS

Continuing a series on our beliefs in plain English by Rev. Julian Duckworth (Sydney).

This time we'll take a look at what's called INFLUX.

This teaching called influx is one of the really big ones and it runs through all the beliefs of the New Church.

Don't be put off by the word influx. Think of it as something FLOWING IN, a bit like water through pipes into your tap. Every time you turn your tap on, you draw on a bit more water that's coming through pipes all the way from the reservoir.

It's all about being on the receiving end of things. But for us, it's about receiving life from God, all the time. We're not self-perpetuating - God's life is keeping us being in existence every nanosecond. In fact that's happening with everything. God flows in and keeps it all there.

Of course we don't feel that. We feel we are in charge of ourselves and free to do what we like! That's how God wants it to feel to us so that we seem to be free agents rather than puppets on a string.

God's inflowing life means that he - God - is always in control and managing the way things go. It brings God very close to us, so close that he is in everything in us. So, if we make bad choices, God knows that and adapts accordingly. We can't say what God does, but, through influx, he might close off something in our mind and open something else so that it's safer for us in the long run.

God's long-term aim is to help us choose the things that make heaven, and choose them because we want that kind of life. So, God's influx into everything creates a lot of things to help us do just that – a beautiful world, sex and attraction, love, family life, sleep and dreams, friendships, abilities, everybody's different, sudden rushes of inspiration, and so much more. We think so much of it is our doing, we need to get it that it's God and we're on the receiving end of it all.
