FROM THE MINISTER

THE TREE OF LIFE

I really enjoy looking at trees. They are so complete in themselves. They cover suburban areas with a bold presence and a relieving greenery which softens the otherwise straight lines and squareness of new units. Yesterday we saw a huge tree standing between the road and a seven-level multi storey car park and I saw that every level of the car park got an equal share of its branches and leaves. May it never get a council order to be taken out!

The Bible begins and ends with the same images. In the garden of Eden were the tree of life, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil from which Eve and then Adam ate, beguiled by the serpent. Four rivers flowed out of Eden. In the last book of the Bible, Revelation, at the end there's again mention of the tree of life and the river of the waters of life. It is like 'bookends'.

If we are mindful of Eden and how it got lost, the ending of the Bible – where once again the tree and river are included – seems to tell us that Eden can be regained. Not as it was, but now different. And the difference is that our experience of living and growing and trying hard and sometimes struggling and overcoming has turned us into different people with more maturity and a sense of God.

The book of Revelation version of the tree and the river is curious to say the least. Here's what it says, "In the middle of its street, and on

either side of the river, was the tree of life." This looks as if the river is flowing right through the middle of the tree of life! But I don't think rivers actually do that. But I think I am missing the whole point. Here's why.

We are celebrating New Church Day later in June. We often use the book of Revelation. We often make use of the vision of the Holy City, and if you closely examine everything about the Holy City, called the New Jerusalem, you see that everything is being brought together and coalesced. This is because, spiritually, the vision is about the ideal where everything has become perfected. The city is a perfect cube is one example. No need of the sun or the moon because God illuminates it and the Lamb is its light, is another.

So the tree and the river which are separate in Eden are now united in Revelation, like one thing. The tree of life means love and faith, the river of the waters of life means spiritual truths which are to do with love and faith and which help us understand them. They each mean what they do because a tree grows and fruits and a river flows with its water and flows into our mind from God. I hope this quick explanation makes sense.

Brought together, what we have is the ideal picture of our life, and for us now, here, something for us to work towards. We are to become integrated. Our beliefs are to be the prompt for the way we live our lives and not be something kept separate from that. What we think is to be the same as what we do or say. What we love is to be the same as the way we are.

Think about what that would be like, being like that. No pretence, no simulation, but genuine honesty and transparency. Perhaps this is why the vision of the Holy City talks about its light being clear as crystal and its streets being pure gold, like transparent glass. Nothing is to be hidden in the ideal. This is something for us to work towards, still with care in this world, but aiming for an authentic life which has been brought about by God with us, and with our co-operation.

Our two Sydney Representatives, Graham Hall and Wayne Kasmar, reported to our Committee with enthusiasm and some details at its May meeting.

I had the enormous pleasure to step down from my national Presidency and to induct Rev. David Moffat into the Presidency early on the first morning. It was very moving. David did an excellent job of chairing the Assembly for virtually the whole of the two days.



The induction included a well-worded service and the laying on of hands, and the presentation of a President's copy of the Word which includes inscriptions of three previous Presidents.

After the service everyone came in a circle around David and gave him their blessing, a hug, and some encouraging words. This was a significant moment for the New Church in Australia and New

Zealand. We all wish David well in his new position for the church.

THE 2016 CENSUS AND OUR CHURCH


The census will be done during August which is still some time off. I had a notice from Kevin Attwater, the Secretary of the New Church in Australia about the official and recognised name of the New Church.

I recently conducted the thanksgiving service for Leonard Eldridge who is John Eldridge's father. It was a full chapel with quite a few people standing at the sides and back.



SWEDENBORG ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRALIA

We have been holding a Swedenborg Reading Group for almost two years now and it is very much appreciated by those who take part.



We have been using the book called 'Regeneration' which is a compilation of five sections from Swedenborg which help us understand what regeneration or spiritual practice involves.

We have just finished the third section and are ready to move on to the fourth one which is about the different levels of our spiritual life. One way of describing these is to call these different levels

Love, Wisdom and Usefulness. They are all important.

We sit in a circle and each of us reads one or two paragraphs in turn. After a full circle of reading we open it all up for any comments about what has come up in the reading, or any questions. Then we continue with the reading and go round once more, perhaps about three times in all.

It is simple, it doesn't need any preparation, and it is amazing what comes up in the discussion. I believe it is another form of personal worship and devotion. You may be interested in joining in, or trying it out, and you are welcome to do that.

We meet on the fourth Friday of the month, in the church, and it is at 6.30 p.m. if there is a talk afterwards, or we start at 7.45 p.m. if there is not a talk that evening. Just come along and join in. Handouts of the section we are using are available for everyone.

There is tea or coffee and biscuits afterwards. And there is no charge made for those who come to this activity.

THE PILLARS OF NEW CHURCH BELIEFS



Continuing a series about our beliefs in plain English. This time we're looking at **FUTURE EVENTS**.

This one isn't such a major teaching in the New Church but we do have some helpful insights about it. However, it is a major teaching in many churches, among those who think about the end of the world, the physical return of Jesus, and who see in the words of the Bible the actual prophecies about such things. You may have come across these at times.

Let's start with the idea of us knowing anything about the future. We do have some teaching about that, and it is that we are not allowed to see into the future because if we did, we would try and interfere with what we saw, for our own advantage. This would be right against the order of things.

Only the Lord knows the things about the future because he is not fixed in time like we are, but sees eternal things as being present. This gives the Lord full knowledge of all outcomes and especially the way we are heading. Because of this and because he cares about us so much, he not only keeps it from us but also manages it with infinite care.

The one thing the Lord wants is for us to choose the life which leads to heaven. He can't make us do that, nor would he, but he can do several things. He can steer things so that we are kept from knowing truths before we are ready for them. He can also make us forget harmful memories and quash them so that they no longer trouble us.

Another thing the Lord can do, especially if we are following a spiritual path in our life, is to let us become aware of our current trends. And then, seeing the way we are heading in some selfish direction, we stop, and choose the better way.

We should not be too concerned about the future but live in the present, and trust the Lord with all our futures.

THE CAMP IN JANUARY 2017
