FROM THE MINISTER

GOODNESS ONLY KNOWS !

No, this isn't a comment about the result of the election but an introduction to the idea of good and goodness. You can see that the heading is a phrase we often use but it's so common that we might not have stopped and thought about what we're saying. "Goodness only knows!"

I was introduced to such sayings several years ago when, during a service Ruth and I went to, one of our retired ministers came out with a beauty. "You know," he told us, "people say that something is too good to be true." And then he went on to comment superbly about how ridiculous that idea is and how if something is genuinely good it must be absolutely true! I could have hugged him.

If something is good, it can mean many things. It might taste good, do us good, feel good, encourage us, help someone practically, be right, be just and fair, and so on. But maybe we can go deeper and get to the heart of something that is truly good. In our teachings there is a great phrase that "Good is love in action". I really like that because it brings love out into doing something which is good.

I am sure it's no coincidence that 'Good' and 'God' are very similar words. I'd even go so far as to say that from our end of things it's very helpful to think of genuine goodness being the will of God. We're given minds and hearts, and arms and legs, so that we can go around doing what is good, knowing why we do it and how best to.

In one of the epistles in the New Testament there is a powerful statement. *“And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God.”* (Romans 8.28) That sounds very encouraging. If you love God and if you love what is of God, then your life will begin to come together well and be on an even keel or a good footing.

Try to see that this is not so much about events out there in life as about things going on inside you. Good people get killed in road accidents as well as bad or stupid people, but maybe not so many. People I have known who seem genuinely good have died from cancer or lost their job. And yet, while that is true, I would still suggest that living a sensible life based on a love for God brings us a protection. There are many things I just wouldn't do, so I don't.

It's about all things working together for good, and this is mostly meant to happen inside us, in our mind and heart. One way of describing it is to see how our understanding of life broadens out and deepens when we go on the path of a love of God. We're steadier and more observant.

I remember another retired minister making us smile when he said that being in a bad mood is likely to trigger off a chain of events. You break the milk bottle and cut your hand and then scald yourself on the cooker as you reach out, and then miss the step as you rush out of the room for a cloth. This is a picture of all things not working together. Try and picture the opposite, and you've got it. Good for you!

Good is love in action. Love is a verb as well as a noun. Find some way to do something useful and do it for somebody else than yourself. God did well in making us individual people because while we might feel lonely or feel sorry for ourselves we can also begin to build relationships and make bridges and find out what we have in common and learn from each other. After creating it all, God saw everything that He had made, and indeed it was very good. Of course it was, because God knew what wonderful good things would come from it all.

Joe, his wife Ellie and their son Damian live in Berowra. He has been the President of the Swedenborg Association of Australia for a term of

five years and has been a regular contributor to its quarterly journal, Candela.

THE SPECIAL NUMBER 7



Seven days in a week
 Seven notes in a normal musical scale
 Seven colours in the rainbow
 Seven chakras
 Seven New Testament virtues
 Seven days of creation

This month of July is the seventh month of the year. The number 7 has always been seen as significant by many cultures and religions. It's a number that stands alone and doesn't fit in. It is the first real prime number with no other relationship before it.

It is also seen as the truly spiritual number. The best-known example of this is the seventh day on which God rested after the six days of creation. And Islam has the seven heavens which might have given us the idea of being in seventh heaven.

In the Hebrew alphabet the 7th letter is 'zayin' our 'z' It looks like this:



Its name means 'a sword put away in its sheath' like the picture shows. In other words a sword at rest, which seems close to the Creation story of the seventh day on which God rested after ending his work. Even the shape looks fairly like our number 7 but I don't know if there's a connection.

7 is seen as holy, perfection, completion and divine. We have what the Bible calls the seventh day or later, the Sabbath. "You shall do no work on the Sabbath for on the seventh day God rested....." What did God rest from doing? That's easy. Making everything. Yes, but what does that mean? It means the Lord's work with us, regenerating us, remaking us, changing us from being worldly to being heavenly, from being self-centred to being someone who serves others. This work is God's work and God's wish for each of us. And when it is done it is holy, perfect, complete and divine. And we have been made.

THE PILLARS OF NEW CHURCH BELIEFS



Continuing a series about our beliefs in plain English.

This time we are thinking about **WHAT HAPPENS TO OUR EVILS?**

Let's start with some explanation. You and I are not evil. You and I are likely to be fairly normal well-intentioned people. But even so, simply by being human and because we get caught up in how things seem, we have evils which can influence us. Everybody does. Nobody is perfect.

Even when we are living an active religious life and wanting to do what is good, various evil tendencies affect us. Part of religion is knowing this and knowing how to manage it properly. Nobody, least of all God, is blaming us for being like this. It is just how it is.

Now we come to the point and can ask, What happens to our evils? What happens to them when we have turned away from their influence and seen what they can do to us (and yes, to other people too)? Some churches would say that when we turn to Jesus and make our personal commitment to him for what he has done for us, then our evils are no longer of any account and they are wiped away as if they never were.

This is like saying that your belief in Jesus overrides everything else and to use the phrase 'I am saved' puts it very clearly. But the New Church doesn't go along with this. It says that when we turn to the Lord (as we should) we then work with the Lord in dealing with whatever evils are there in us. And when the Lord and we have sorted it out, then these evils are taken away, made dormant, but not wiped away as if they had never been.

The reason for this is that they can be brought back and shown to us as gentle reminders, never to accuse us but just to help us see our progress more clearly. They are over and done with, and dumped at the side, but if needed, we can be shown them, and that is to help us.
