FROM THE MINISTER

DEALING WITH NATURAL DISASTERS

You may know that many insurance companies have a property exclusion clause that describes certain natural disasters as "acts of God", being outside human control and inevitable. Tornadoes, earthquakes, violent winds and very high tides would be some of them. The phrase 'act of God' at least brings God into the tragic consequences in which He certainly is ... present, supporting, caring, loving and bringing each person over from this world into the next.

But to lay the cause of something like the tragic recent earthquake in Amatrice in Umbria in Italy as something that is designated and timed in the mind of God is misplaced. God covers everything but God does not cause everything. The idea that the Lord "sends" such things makes God out to be a Viking warlord. The only things that the Lord ever sends are good things, blessings, people's kindness, angels with us at times, and the seasons like the new spring we are awaiting.

I have two personal associations with God and natural disasters. One was after a church class on Divine Providence years ago when I was about 25. As we went out, I heard a man say to a lady that he could see how Providence worked with every single thing in life, and then added 'but I can't yet get my head round natural disasters'.

Some years after this I was at a weekend church retreat and a minister told us that a natural disaster happens when God needs to fill up a hole in the spiritual world! This is complete nonsense. There are no 'holes'

in the spiritual world. When 6000 people are wiped out all at once by an earthquake, each one of them goes into the next life and takes their place in it. And without fail, each of them is welcomed, helped, given time and patience, and gradually introduced into this new level of life.

We are such 'numbers' people if we're not careful. 30 people in church is great, 11 is a bit thin. Death tolls make us feel sadder as they rise higher and become the measurement of the tragedy. When a newsreader tells us that in a terrorist attack, only one person was killed, we tend to think that it's not so bad then! In the Lord's eyes it is on the same basis every time – no fleets of heavenly ambulances – but simply dealing with each of the people involved, and fully so.

The Lord doesn't "send" but I do think he "takes". He takes people safely from this life into the next. But there is something more. I think the Lord takes away the memories of those involved about the event, the horror, the crashing, the pain, and relieves them of this as quickly as possible. It is the poor survivors who will bear many years of adjustment and disturbance, and yet the Lord is with them too, helping their healing. And so are other people, and the Lord is with them too.

Natural disasters are simply the signs of a living changing natural world which is habitable by people and yet it is still settling down after its creation by God. If it was all settled and nothing ever happened, it would probably be way beyond human occupation! So I think two things come out of this: God created things and people, and in creating, he had to allow for a volatile environment and all its goings-on. This is given – God-created – so that you and I can exist!

The other thing is that such a world that erupts and cascades can help make us feel more for each other, with empathy and care, and come to appreciate life, honour the fact of death, rebuild Amatrice... And perhaps we should finish with the thought that we too have our own spiritual or personal earthquakes, there in ourselves, changing our world right around or at least giving us a wake-up call. Does God send these? I don't think so, but I know that God is very close to us then.

THE NUMBER EIGHT



the symbol of Infinity...

The number eight is possibly one of the most exciting numbers there is. In numerology, it is one of the best numbers for your name or birth sign (they say), but more importantly, the Bible mentions "On the eighth day" quite a number of times.

It is basically the symbol of "new beginnings". It comes immediately after 7, which is the Sabbath Day which in turn comes straight after 6, the days of work and labour. So we get the '8' pattern, of a new beginning after the stop and rest of the Sabbath.

New beginnings are important for us. We take a break, and then we come back to our work refreshed, and get going again. We reach a watershed or problem and decide we will get going again, anew. This is the idea of the 8.

Look at the shape of 8 though. It starts at the bottom and gyrates to the top and then comes back down to the bottom. Notice especially the 'twist' in the middle, perhaps the symbol of a joining point – heaven with earth, truth with some practical use, God with us, and us with God.

Turn it on its side, to the infinity symbol, and you have 'you' reaching out into the lives of other people, and them into your life. Whatever you may get from 8, it is full of motion, fluidity and connection.

WORTH HEARING ABOUT

A contemporary author, Gregg Braden, well-known for his book about prayer, gratitude and quantum physics, called 'The Isaiah Effect', has spoken about three experiments that were done under very controlled conditions which resulted in quite amazing outcomes.



The first experiment was to create a vacuum inside a container so that the only thing left in it were photons, or (non-physical) particles of light. They measured the distribution of the photons and found

they were random inside the container. Some DNA was placed in the container and the distribution of the photons was re-measured. This time they found that the photons were orderly and aligned with the DNA. The DNA was removed, and the photons stayed orderly, where the DNA had been.

Another experiment was done by the military. White blood cells were collected from donors and put in chambers where electrical changes could be measured. The donors went to a different room and watched video clips which produced different emotions in the donors. The DNA was measured and it showed exactly the same responses as the donor. The same correlation happened when the donor and his DNA were separated by 50 miles. No lessening, no time lag, still the same.



The third experiment involved DNA from an independent source, measured according to the feelings of the people doing the research. When they felt gratitude, love and appreciation, the DNA strands unwound and the length of the DNA increased. When

they felt anger, frustration or stress, the DNA tightened.

The point of all this seems to be that energy and emotions are very connected. Time and distance are virtually irrelevant in this area. One outcome seems to be that positive emotions create a resistance to disease, and that things that seem separate are highly connected. It is science approaching the spiritual level of life.

The talk refers to the works of great Sufi mystic Ibn Arabi, the warrior sheik, Abd al-Kader, Ken Wilber, founder of the Integral Institute and evolutionary anthropologist, Cadell Last.

Sufism seeks the selfless experience and actualization of the Divine attributes in us, through devotion to realise the Divine love and wisdom. Sufism is focused on a personal experience of truth. Sufi's are Islamic mystics. Sufi work resonates with Swedenborg. His advice is not to leave selfexamination until our outer self is taken off to find out what our inner self is like, but to conduct regular self-examination.

THE PILLARS OF NEW CHURCH BELIEFS



Continuing a series about our beliefs in plain English. This time we are going to look at the **TRINITY**

Let's start with something we're all familiar with, a chair. You may be sitting on one right now. A chair has three things about it, what it is made of, what shape it is, and what it is meant to be used for. These three things are quite different from each other, but they all come together in the chair.

It is basically just the same with what is called the Trinity which is about God. Traditionally, Christianity talks of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. If you keep the fact that there is only the one God, this trinity way of describing the activity of God is perfectly okay.

But if you pull the Trinity apart and create the idea that in some way there are three persons making God, it becomes complicated and even wrong. The classic example of this is where some Christians say that Jesus as the Son of God offered himself to God to become a sacrifice in a human life so that God and Man could be reconciled. See how complicated this becomes. This is the problem with the Trinity.

Always stay with One God not Three. It was God that was Jesus! And God's presence is the Holy Spirit with us. One of the best trinities to use about God is to think of him as the Creator, the Redeemer and the Saviour. Translated that means God creates everything there is, God is stronger than the power of evil, and God's spirit works with us as we try to follow God's way and be a really good person.

Most people switch off with the Trinity, which is a great pity. It doesn't seem to have much connection with practical everyday life, and yet it does, when you keep it right. We receive life from God; we have freedom to choose, from God, and we feel the power of God in our own life as we show love, live well and respect other people.
