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A Pastoral Message from Rev. Glenn Alden This Too Will Pass

We have just come through some days of 33 plus temperatures. Summer is definitely here. Sometimes I remember to use temperature extremes to reflect on the joys and sorrows associated with the changing of the seasons and

changes of state.

A farmer friend talked about the way seasons are "all there is" in his life. The reality of his livelihood is so deeply connected to the natural world and the changing of seasons that he is aware of it all the time. I remember a time when I



was a farmer. It is good to think back on that reality and remember how closely I was connected to seasons, weather, the outdoors, having to deal with the world exactly as it is. It reminded me that though we can't control the seasons, we can certainly predict them. We can prepare ourselves mentally and physically for the change, knowing for certain that it is coming.

Another person spoke about the cycle of the seasons being so reassuring. I guess we all have a season or seasons that we like better than others. This can change, depending on where we live. I once lived in a climate where extreme cold was for me the harshest seasonal reality, minus 40 degrees was not unusual. Daily highs of less than -20 for weeks could be expected through from November to March. Our visit to the New Church in Australia church camp north of Brisbane reminded me once again that in some places extreme heat and humidity is the harshest seasonal reality. Here in Melbourne we are in what is for me the hardest season of the year. Summer will pass. Summer will come around again.

Renewal is a theme many associate with the seasons. Spring, birth and rebirth, and new things growing; always comes around again, no matter what. Changes of state, of our moods, of the challenges we face in overcoming negative emotions, help us to gain perspective. We will not always be discouraged, nor will we always be filled with joy. We will not always wrestle with resentment, nor will we always feel gratitude. We will not always battle anxiety and fear, nor will we always experience peace and courage. Change is the one constant, and like spring it is tangible reassurance that good things will return and that life will prevail over death. The Melbourne New Church congregation is experiencing change in the life of the church. This is not a cause for worry or fear or even joy. It just is. Everything must change. Reflecting on the seasons can raise our minds above the external or material focus.

Swedenborg writes that the whole of the created universe is a theatre reflecting God. We can see, observe, and reflect on so many lessons associated with the changing of the seasons. For today, I choose to accept the natural world as it is – God given, awe inspiring, out of my control. My friend Kris says that there is always spiritual work to be done. My spiritual work for today is to seek out the blessings in the heat, to work with it as reality rather than wishing it were not there. I wish for you all to find much enjoyment in the season. If looking for blessings in the heat is too much of a stretch for you, perhaps you can find blessings in the promise that "this too shall pass."
