# \* \* \* \* \* "Let's Start at the Very Beginning"

As I am writing this we are preparing to return to our regular schedule of services (Sundays at 10:00am). I knew the lock-down wouldn't last for ever and just a few weeks in my thoughts turned to the question of what message should we reopen with. When contemplating this question over the past few weeks one sentence



kept announcing itself in my head; "Let's start at the very beginning."

Most of you will probably recognise that line and the tune that goes with it as the "Do-Re-Mi" song from "The Sound fo Music." For anyone who knows me and is aware of my own lack of musical talent it may come as a surprise to know that it is my all-time favourite movie. And, as I continued to reflect on what tone I wanted to strike as we returned to regular services I could not escape that song. I took it as a sign.

Let's start at the very beginning
A very good place to start
When you read you begin with A-be-see
When you sing you begin with do-re-mi

For me the message I received was one of let's start with the basics. I thought of a reset. When your favourite sports teams return to practice after their off-season they begin with the basics, they begin by reestablishing their foundation of fitness and skills. They do this because the basics are essential to everything else they wish to do. And, while Genesis is the very beginning of the bible, the basics of faith, the starting

point of any real spiritual journey, rebirth or reestablishment is the truths expressed in the Ten Commandments.

So, when you read you begin with A-B-C, when you sing you begin with do-re-mi, and when you praise God you begin with 1-2-3. Let's begin.

We began our Ten Commandments series on the 24th with a look first at

what Jehovah said with respect to all of the Commandments, what He said about how we are to "hold" them.

Carefully obey the commands I am giving you today...love the Lord your God and serve him with all your heart and soul... write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

Deuteronomy 11:13-20 (portions)

These words were given to teach us that love to the Lord is to be written upon every thought and intention. Every natural motive must be imbued with it; every natural truth must become an outward



form of it. It must be written upon all forms of human society, on all human employments, on all our sorrows and joys. It must be written in our hearts and minds. Our life must speak the thought and our hands must do it. Then His will will be done as in heaven so upon the earth.

Concluding this piece it seems only apt that I return to "Do-Re-Mi" and remind you of the closing lines.

# "Between Sleeping and Waking"

Twice each day we go through a short period of semi-conscious drowsiness between sleeping and waking, and between waking and sleeping. One is called our "hypnagogic" state and the other is called our "hypnapompic" state ... not names to remember! During these states we are drowsy or 'floating' around in our relaxed mind, getting a flow of gentle thoughts or pictures or



both, and being in a very peaceful state which is receiving and accepting everything which comes into it. Even though it is short, perhaps around three minutes, it seems to be a beneficial, healing, pleasant period, which kind of suggests it is important for us.

It isn't being asleep, it isn't being awake; it's being in-between the two. Sleep brings dreams or oblivion, this state doesn't. Wakefulness brings clear thought, planning, concern for the coming day, none of which is around in being "between sleeping and waking".

The two times each day that these happen are quite different for obvious reasons; one is coming around from sleep to being awake, the other is from being awake to falling asleep. In that last one, which I often describe as a 'daily surrendering', we hand ourselves over to whatever we hand it to; for some it's to fatigue, for some it's to thankfulness for the day, for some it is to the Lord, after a prayer, and ... away you go, over the edge, falling, tumbling, and being asleep.

The 'morning' one is not really the opposite of that. I think of it a bit like someone is doing a personal jigsaw inside us, where we start with nothing joined and bits get added until we're all joined up and "ready for breakfast". If I thought about colours coming in, they'd be pink, purple and various blues. But yours might be different.

The more interesting thing, though, especially with the morning one, is that it seems to be a short period of calm peaceful spiritual heavenly flowing-in – we might well say, influx. Things come in moving forms, with colours and perhaps swirls, maybe tingling sounds, and there is this feeling of bliss and enjoyment and going with everything which is arriving.

It seems that this is an important time for us in being connected with heaven and angels, and behind them, with the Lord's love and blessing on us. If we made words during times like these, it might be, "I am here; all is well; it is good; soothing safety" ... or the wonderful biblical words from Deuteronomy, "Underneath are the everlasting arms" (Dt 33:27)

Here are things that our church teachings say about these interesting periods. Swedenborg wrote, "One morning, very sweet singing, which was heard at some height above me, roused me, and during the first wakefulness, which is more inward, peaceful and sweet than the rest of the day, I could be kept for some time in the spirit, as it were, out of the body." (Conjugial Love 155a)

"When, on being awakened, I thought about that kind of wakefulness, I wanted to get into that state of wakefulness, for it is in this state that the

interior person is being ruled by the Lord." (Spiritual Diary 4251, and also look at the longer 4250).

It is, for sure, a good thing that we get blessed by being out-of-control and being given divine grace, twice a day. Enjoy!

#### **A New Church Day Reflection**

In the Easter story I have always been drawn to the manner in which the Lord did not meet the expectations of His followers. Even His disciples seemed to often be quite "thick" in the way they received, or didn't receive, His teachings. Several times the Word includes scenes like this one between the Lord and Philip: "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and yet you still don't know who I am? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father! So why are you asking me to show him to you?" (John 14:9)

It strikes me that it is this human tendency to steadfastly stick to one's expectations, even when ample evidence has piled up to show otherwise, that keeps people holding on to that idea/expectation of a literal and natural Second Coming of the Lord.

Most people have heard of "Judgment Day" but few know that it actually took place in the spiritual world during the year 1757, two hundred and sixty-three years ago. The expectation is that this judgment will bring about a cataclysmic end of the world as we know it and herald the promised Second Coming of the Lord.

But it did not happen as expected. What took place instead was a spiritual judgment with tremendous spiritual consequences, but with little noticeable effect in this world.

Sixty-three years ago, on the 200th anniversary of this event, Bishop George de Charms of the General Church of the New Jerusalem noted in this journal: "No man living, except Emanuel Swedenborg, was aware at the time of the tremendous changes taking place in the spiritual world....In the Spiritual Diary and in The Last Judgment and Babylon Destroyed [published in 1758] Swedenborg gives an eyewitness account of this momentous event.

He tells of storms and eruptions and earthquakes that left great cities in ruins. He describes how the good among the inhabitants were protected...and organized into a new heaven; while the evil, fleeing in terror, cast themselves into hell. All this took place within the short period of a single year." He continues: "[These spiritual events] produced no sudden upheaval of human society on earth. Life here went on as before.... Even now, after the lapse of two hundred years, the fact that such a spiritual judgment has taken place is known only to those few who belong to the New Church..." (New Church Life 1957, p.1).

The Heavenly Doctrine confirms that little changed outwardly in the natural world as a result of the spiritual upheavals brought about by the Last Judgment. Civil affairs and even various religious sects continue as before. But henceforth, we are told, "the man of the church will be in a more free state of thinking on matters of faith...because spiritual freedom has been restored to him" (Last Judgment 73).

And yet, I am left to wonder about this dynamic of expectations of the Lord's Second Coming for people today. Sometimes I look around at the difficulty we have in spreading the word about the truth of the Second Coming and I wonder; is our message rejected because it does not meet expectations? Is the message itself, "crucified" like the Lord because it does not meet with deeply imbedded and natural expectations?



The religions tree presented one big question, "why was Swedenborg not on that map?"

Several plausible reasons were eventually offered for this, the most likely of which is that Swedenborg covered the whole cosmological territory, giving us the whole picture, the inside story. He went from the root (God) and trunk (Most Ancients) all the way to the leaves (read his Arcana Coelestia, True Christian Religion, Spiritual Diary, Divine Love & Wisdom,




Divine Providence for starters). If there is a real world, and a benevolent all-capable God, and a design and plan for our lives, and a revelation which tells us about that, then we should see all religions in some way reflect that. And we do, not just in the moral laws they offer – their equivalent of the commandments – but also in their aspiration for spiritual wellbeing, of seeking to live a life of selfless service and create and enjoy happiness together.

It must have been foreseen that us modern scientific and rational folk long for confirmation of the details about the nature and plans of the Lord God, intimate details of the spiritual world – a world which is with us daily in our thoughts and feelings and potentials, and which we will enter ourselves later. Hence Swedenborg's account of his back-stage tour of most that we could ever wish to know. Whether we believe it or not? That's up to us. The Lord is loving enough to leave us in total freedom about our choice to believe it or not.

And now we're talking of choice, that brings us to our new 'brainy' wall-display. It's a map of cognitive 'biases' which are systematic errors of thinking and judging in our decision making.

It's a map of how we often behave when we need to make quick decisions or form some kind of judgement or point of view about something. Our perceptions, our views and beliefs are based on many



impressions. But processing impressions is an interactive process. We bring to an impression what we have previously learned, heard, or know. When something already existing in us meets an impression, it becomes a perception. But there are often times that these perceptions are on shaky

grounds. When we make decisions too rapidly or when we have too much information and need to filter or to summarise. When we don't have access to all the data, we still prefer to make a decision, to have a viewpoint, an opinion. And we often don't know how we make decisions, even though we think we do. And consequently we are also affected by impressions about ourselves which are skewed in our favour rather than exact and true. If you survey everyone driving on a particular road in one afternoon if they are a better driver than the average driver on the road, you will find that much more than half answers 'yes'. But that is statistically not possible, because half of the driver would perform worse than the average while half performs better. But that's not the collective self-reported answer of all the drivers.

To me it's a spiritual chart. I believe that honest self-reflection is the beginning of the spiritual process, and that we should study where we are prone to make mistakes. What's the point of a general confession that I've missed the mark, yet I don't care to go into detail and correct it. I feel that I must go into detail in order to see if it needs correction, and then get on with correcting it. The whole process is worth studying, which hopefully leads to having the results implemented and activated in our life. Now that sounds like a hearty winter process to pursue.
