Tests are conducted immediately upon entering the waiting room; that is almost empty of chairs; just a very few strategically placed very far apart. No magazines to read and no toys out at all. But this is all very fine.

The care that is being taken is very much appreciated. Supermarket shopping can take a very long time at the checkouts; as red lines and markers on the floor spaced out widely, indicate where one stands until the next available space ahead becomes vacant.

All staff stay well protected behind their new Perspex screens. Hand sanitisers as one enters the store and trolley wipes are there to disinfect the trolley you are about to use; even if you are wearing protective gloves, still wise to do so.

For a while, many of us had online orders, and then delivered to our door, all contactless, as paid beforehand. The supermarkets did very well in supplying all items ordered. If that item was not available, they chose the best substitute one.

Local chemists have been delivering orders to us for any of our medication scripts and vitamins or any other pharmaceutical supplies. It has all been very helpful during Home Stay. Browsing the internet for stores that may be closed, has become quite a normal thing to do. Then paying online and awaiting delivery from Australia Post; has worked well.

It may have made us feel a bit lazy too.

All these shop assistances have been doing so well under difficult circumstances.





## NEW CHRISTIAN CHURCH BELIEFS

LET US ALL BE CAREFUL AND WATCHFUL. A REAL TIME OF NEED – TO “LOOK AFTER OUR NEIGHBOURS”.

The first thing we might think about is Jesus saying, ‘Love your neighbour’ or ‘You shall love your neighbour as yourself.’

In the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus asked those who were listening, ‘Who was neighbour to the man who got hurt?’ Obviously, it was the one who helped him. Do you get the point? Neighbour is best seen as being active and doing something to help someone else.

You and I probably deal with quite a number of different people any day of the week. Some will be fun to be with, some easy company, some not so easy perhaps, and some will just be hard going. All of these are our ‘neighbours’ or nearby (nigh) people.

We can all imagine we could do helpful things to people on the other side of town because that’s all theory. ‘I would be friendly/pleasant/kind etc. But it’s different with the actual people we’re involved with because we are then in a relationship. We have to take their moods and wishes into consideration and they might not care much for ours!

In our church we sometimes say that it is really the Lord who is the neighbour. That might sound really peculiar! But it helps us when we are dealing with nearby other people who are not the same as us. These people are our neighbour of course, but if we just go in blind, who knows what might happen and someone might get hurt.

So in dealing with people (neighbours) we need to keep the Lord in mind too – after all He is with every one of us, trying to lead us. If someone snaps at us, we probably feel like defending ourselves and snapping back or licking our wounds. Appreciating that the Lord is the neighbour in that other person is going to help us avoid either of those, and we may be able to say something that helps them handle it better.

In the end the neighbour is the good that can be brought out in someone.

## “GET IN YOUR LANE”

Spanning the river near our house is a one-way traffic bridge. On the bridge are three lanes. All traffic on the left-hand lane, must turn left, which is toward the cemetery. All traffic on the middle lane must go straight ahead – which takes you to the city centre. All traffic on the right-hand lane must turn right – which leads to the airport.

If you want to go to the airport, it's useless to be on the left-hand lane; there is no crossing over when you are once on the bridge. From the left-hand lane you will end up in the cemetery, whether you want to or not! Therefore, all travellers are advised to get into the correct lane before they reach the bridge.
