The Twelve Gateways of the Lord

Finding Power, Healing and Victory in every area of your life

Luke 9:1-9

- 1 Then he called his twelve disciples together, and gave them power and authority over all devils, and to cure diseases.
- 2 And he sent them to preach the kingdom of God, and to heal the sick.
- 3 And he said unto them, Take nothing for your journey, neither staves, nor scrip, neither bread, neither money; neither have two coats apiece.
- 4 And whatsoever house ye enter into, there abide, and thence depart.
- 5 And whosoever will not receive you, when ye go out of that city, shake off the very dust from your feet for a testimony against them.
- 6 And they departed, and went through the towns, preaching the gospel, and healing everywhere.
- 7 Now Herod the tetrarch heard of all that was done by him: and he was perplexed, because that it was said of some, that John was risen from the dead;
- 8 And of some, that Elias had appeared; and of others, that one of the old prophets was risen again. 9 And Herod said, John have I beheaded: but who is this, of whom I hear such things? And he desired to see him.

Introduction

The purpose of spiritual life and spiritual practice is to 'come' into the Kingdom and grow in an ever-expanding relationship with the Lord. To move forward we need set pathways to walk along to fellowship and communion with the Divine. New Jerusalem as revealed in the Apocalypse of John has twelve such gateways and specially designed streets made for us to advance along. No matter what direction we approach the City of Light from there is a way for us to move forward. Sacred Text reveals for us through the archetype of the Twelve what exactly those gateways are. Here is my best offering with assistance drawn from the small work 'The Twelve Apostles' by New Church minister Rev John E. Elliott.

Then he called his twelve disciples together, and gave them power and authority over all devils, and to cure diseases. – Twelve gateways the Lord uses to lead and develop regeneration within the advancing soul.

Most of us, who are familiar with spiritual language, would also be familiar with the idea that the Apostle Peter represents our 'faith' or that James is 'a life of use from spiritual power' and John is 'love' at work inside us. However, here Sacred Text is reminding us that in order for us to experience the fullness of regeneration (*authority over all devils, and to cure diseases*) the Lord chose **Twelve** to send forth and minster the spiritual freedom only found in the Kingdom of God. Thus, it becomes important for us to identify *all* the ways(twelve archetypally speaking) wherein the Lord has invested His power for salvation. To this end, I would like to explore with you, albeit it briefly, the significance of all Twelve. Why did the Lord choose twelve? The reason is that Faith/Peter on its own is not enough to bring us into spiritual maturity. Consider how inconsistent Peter could often be. Unless we work with all Twelve ways (heavenly practices) and endeavour to receive from their power, we cannot know the fullness of freedom and liberty available for us through the Kingdom of God. It takes time and much effort to identify these Twelve and in some cases, all we are left with is but a few clues. Take Thomas for example. He stands out to many of us because of his profound

episode of doubt concerning the Lord's resurrection. And yet, this alone is almost enough to point out for us the need for 'questions' and 'doubt'. So in this vein, here they are, starting with Peter and ending in Judas Iscariot – 1. We develop *true* Faith (Peter). 2. It leads us into action with genuine Power (James). 3. We experience new Love (John) for the Lord, the Word and our fellow humans. 4. We experience a new willingness to be led of the Lord called Innocence (Andrew). 5. Our affection for the Word is creating Wisdom (Philip) inside of us. 6. And we have a greater level of Discernment (Bartholomew). 7. We start to Question (Thomas) the validity of 'self' as we learn that we truly can trust the Lord. 8. This new trust causes an organic growth in our Devotion (Matthew). 9. And our Service (James the lessor). 10. We find ourself with new Desires (Simon the Zealot) for what is heavenly and wholesome. 11. Gratitude for our inner joy of life enables an organic response called Praise (Judas son of James). 12. And we happily search out any underlying blockages to this process following which discoveries we then shun any negative states in Repentance (Judas Iscariot). (Note -This list is taken from the book of Mark 3:14-19. In the other Gospels, the list appears in slightly different orders with a relevant meaning coming forth there.)

And he sent them [the apostles] to preach the kingdom of God, and to heal the sick. – regenerative states bring the healing, hope and power of the Kingdom of God.

And he said unto them, Take nothing for your journey, neither staves, nor scrip, neither bread, neither money; neither have two coats apiece. – the call to beware of the 'ego' and its desires to own and control what flows in from the Lord.

And whatsoever house ye enter into, there abide, and thence depart. – flexibility to stay with whatever spiritual processes or states are presenting themself to the advancing soul.

And whosoever will not receive you, when ye go out of that city, shake off the very dust from your feet for a testimony against them. – rejection of any feeling, thought or state that opposes these Twelve gateways.

How often do we find ourselves moving along quietly and internally there is a consistent state such as contentment, peace, confidence, assurance, satisfaction etc. Suddenly there is an introduction into our state of something new like a thought or perhaps a new conversation with someone near us. At this moment, everything is disrupted and we experience a flood of different feelings, thoughts and mindsets. This may be positive or it may be negative and we need the adequate tools to discern these new states. Thus, the **Twelve** ways provided by the Lord can become our standard. For example, if the conversation you are engaged in is now filling you with overwhelming feelings of hopelessness, then 'James/Hope/Power' may speak to you and remind you that God is Hope. In such a situation, we are instructed to 'shake off the very dust' from our 'feet' (external thoughts and mindsets) and to move back towards a state or 'way' that is conducive to spiritual life.

And they departed, and went through the towns, preaching the gospel, and healing everywhere. – evidence that one or more of these ways is at work inside the soul.

The Lord tells us in John 15 that if we 'abide' in Him then we assuredly will produce 'abundant' fruit in our lives. The very nature of spiritual fruit is that it heals our wounds, feeds our hunger, quenches our thirst, frees our enslavement, visits/addresses our burdens and estrangements.

Now Herod the tetrarch heard of all that was done by him: and he was perplexed, because that it was said of some, that John was risen from the dead; - a state of temptation wherein the 'ego' struggles with the invasion of power and life coming from the activation of the Twelve.

And of some, that Elias had appeared; and of others, that one of the old prophets was risen again. – the murmurs, chatterings and lies of the false ego.

And Herod said, John have I beheaded: but who is this, of whom I hear such things? And he desired to see him.- the false ego's rejection of the literal sense of the Word (John the baptist) now being confronted and exposed by the Power of the Inner Sense and the manifestation of the Twelve.

Sacred Text calls out to us to stay and abide in the Lord and His way to regeneration. This path holds such promise and hope of healing for all who will stay the course.

Christmas is a powerful time and opportunity to remember and celebrate the possibility of the Lord's birth into our lives. But beyond that grand event, it is also the Lord's growth into maturity and the calling of the Twelve Apostles which is essential to ensure and effect His salvation work. In a marvellous parallel way, following His advent into our lives, He is now summoning these Twelve again within us to affect the fullness of His everlasting Kingdom and all its treasures.

Conclusion

Sacred Text is full of unsearchable riches and at various times in our lives, the Lord desires to reveal some new aspect or facet so that we may advance towards His Holy City – The New Jerusalem. Our 'Lord Jesus Christ' is the invisible God now made visible and He alone is the 'WAY' to everlasting life. In manifold mercy and wisdom, that WAY is offered to us under the umbrella of the TWELVE – Faith, hope and love – Obedience, Wisdom and Discernment – self-examination, devotion and service – desire, praise and transformation.

Right now and on into 2021, may you let the Lord lead you forward into the most exciting journey of all –

'A relationship with God'.

SACRED CIRCLE

UNLOCKING THE POWER OF SACRED LANGUAGE - 40 PARABLES

As we draw near to the last of forty parables (two to go – 'the good shepherd' & 'Abiding in the Vine'), I'm now searching over the parables looking to categorise them into Seven groups – one for each of the seven days of the creation story. Thus, moving forward with Sacred Circle, our time of exploration over the parables will equip us with revelation and wisdom to help us move forward through any of the seven stages we may find ourselves in –

- 1. New Light to help us travel **Day One** (light-bearer/lamp)
- 2. Power to separate from the 'ego' and observe **Day Two** (Seer/eagle)
- 3. Re-engage with the 'new' earth. Same activity, new level **Day Three** (traveller/map)
- 4. Receive special guidance **Day Four** (navigator/compass)
- 5. Nurture, expand & cultivate our inner promise land **Day Five** (Merchant/pearl)
- 6. Defend against and concur negative states within **Day Six** (warrior/sword)
- 7. Relaxing into and delight in loving encounters **Day Seven** (watchman/cup)
