



Key Concept

Being loving toward people you like is easy, you treat them well and show them that you care, you do little things to help them or make them feel better, and so on. Actions like that are equally appropriate (if not more so) for people who you don't get along with on a personal level. But what about people who are actively hateful towards others, or even those who are engaging in criminal acts?

Sometimes the loving thing to do is to try to stop them from going down a bad road. This could involve not helping someone whose goal is to harm or to be destructive; not encouraging vindictive or hateful thoughts or actions; and perhaps having to report on someone who's involved in a crime — even if that person is someone you care about. Sometimes going along with someone in order to avoid a fight with them isn't the best solution for either of you.

We have as our goal whatever we love more than anything else. This is what we focus on overall and in every detail. It is within our will like the hidden current of a river that draws and carries us along even when we are doing something else, because it is what animates us.

What is loved above all is also something we look for and see in others, and something we use to influence them or to cooperate with them.

The way we are is entirely determined by what controls our life. This is what distinguishes us from each other. This is what determines our heaven if we are good and our hell if we are evil. It is our essential will, our self, and our nature. In fact, it is the underlying reality of our life. It cannot be changed after

death because it is what we really are.

What we love is the core of our identity; it determines everything about who we are. If you're wondering what this has to do with divisiveness, take another look at the previous paragraph: "What is loved above all is also something we look for and see in others."

In other words, the way we relate to other people is determined, first and foremost, by what we ourselves most value.

What do you love more than anything else?


The answer might be a specific person or thing, or it might even be an idea or principle. Now, take a step back to think about what that love represents.


Thus, Michael was left with a huge collection of items he had acquired. With just a small unit that he resides in, these boxes of things crowded it so.
